Subject: State Police Commission Rules 8.10(c)2 and 3.

Pursuant to the provisions of State Police Commission Rule 2.10(a), the State Police Commission will hold a public hearing on Thursday, October 19, 2000 to consider repealing and reenacting State Police Commission Rules 8.10(c)2. and 3.. The hearing will begin at 9:00 a.m. in the Conference Room, Eleventh Floor, Wooddale Towers Building, 1885 Wooddale Boulevard, Baton Rouge, Louisiana. These changes are necessary to bring the moving expenses related to these rules in accordance with the State Travel Regulations.

8.10 . . .

(c) Change in Duty Station.

. . .

- 2. The appointing authority may permanently change the duty station of a permanent employee from one geographical area to another with the consent of the employee in which case, the employer may, at the employer's option, pay related relocation expenses, in accordance with State Travel Regulations. Such change shall be reported to the Director.
- 3. The appointing authority may permanently change the duty station of a permanent or probationary employee from one geographical area to another without the consent of the employee, provided that the change is necessary to accomplish the department's mission; is, before such change, approved by the Commission at a public hearing, and provided that the employer shall pay a maximum of \$1700 in relocation expenses, in accordance with State Travel Regulations.

Please review this proposal and furnish, in writing, by October 10, 2000 any comments which you consider pertinent. If you would like to

appear before the Commission and present your comments orally, you are invited to do so. You must notify this office by October 10, 2000 of your intention to address the Commission, in order to be placed on the agenda.

Please post this General Crcular prominently, so that all employees will receive notice of this hearing. If any special accommodations are needed, please notify us prior to the hearing date.
